Nashua Area Radio Society 2020 Field Day Information

It's that time of the year when Amateur Radio operators better known as (Hams) all across the United States and Canada will be setting up various types of radio equipment, along with antenna towers and antennas to participate in the American Radio Relay League (ARRL) event called Field Day.

Field Day is the single most popular on the air event held in the United States and Canada, during the last weekend in June. This event involves over 35,000 amateur radio operators, who gather as Clubs, friends, or groups to operate from remote locations to practice their emergency response capabilities. When disasters strike, Amateur Radio is there providing the necessary communications, whenever, wherever, and for as long as needed, when other means of communication fail.

Due to the COVID-19 virus, the Nashua Area Radio Society (NARS) members will be participating individually in the American Radio Relay League (ARRL) nationwide amateur radio event, known as Field Day. The event is scheduled to take place this Saturday, June 27th starting at 2:00 PM, and continue until Sunday, June 28th ending at 2:00 PM. It is important, especially in a pandemic for us to practice Emergency Communications Skills. Members plan to participate in Field Day from home with their families, many on emergency power, or portable by setting up a station in their back yard or other locations while socially distancing. We will hold an emergency messaging network on the air to allow members to practice their emergency message passing skills. We will also hold a web conference during the event to allow members to share their operating setup with an elected government official and an emergency preparedness agency representative.
